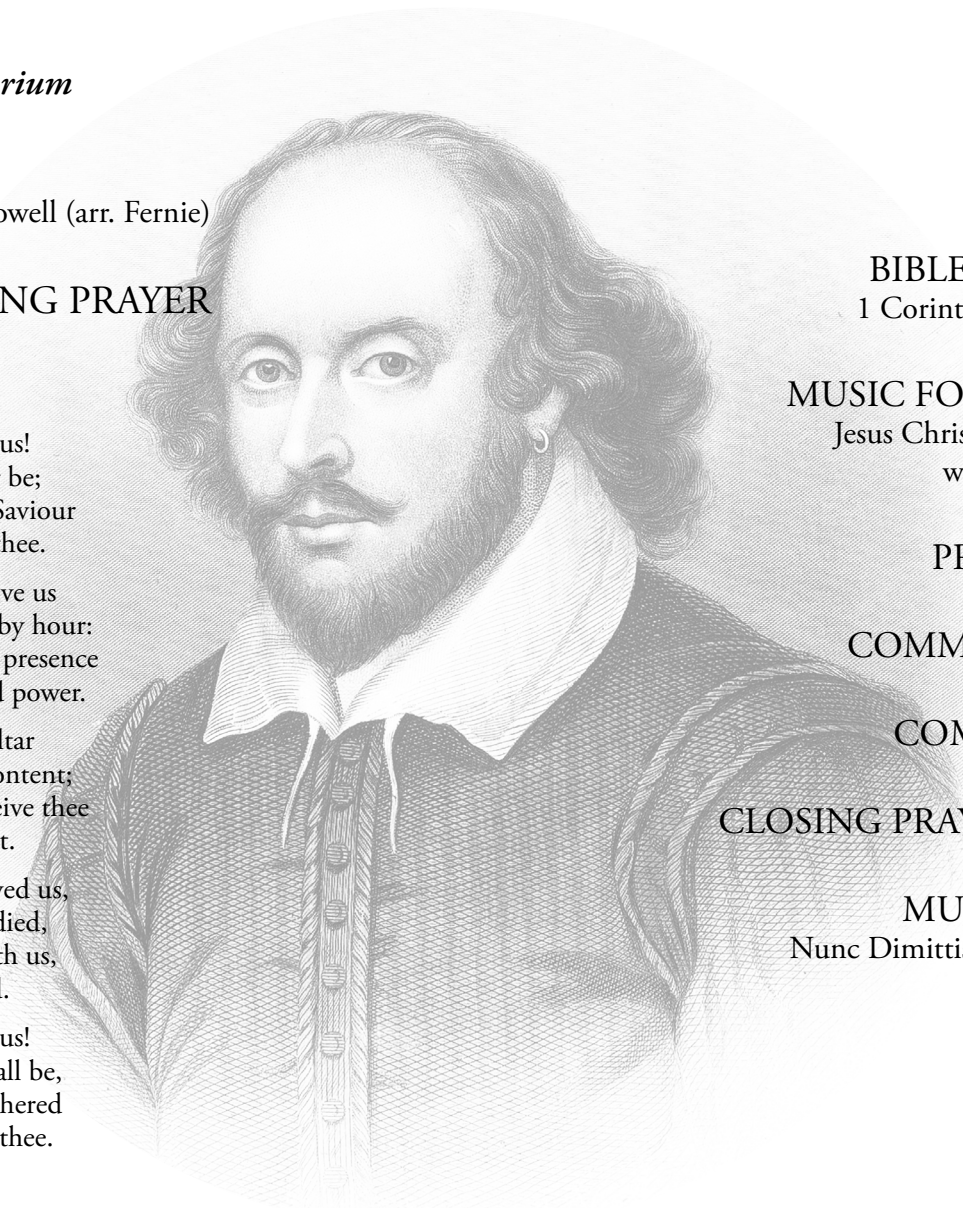
All for Jesus! all for Jesus!

HYMN

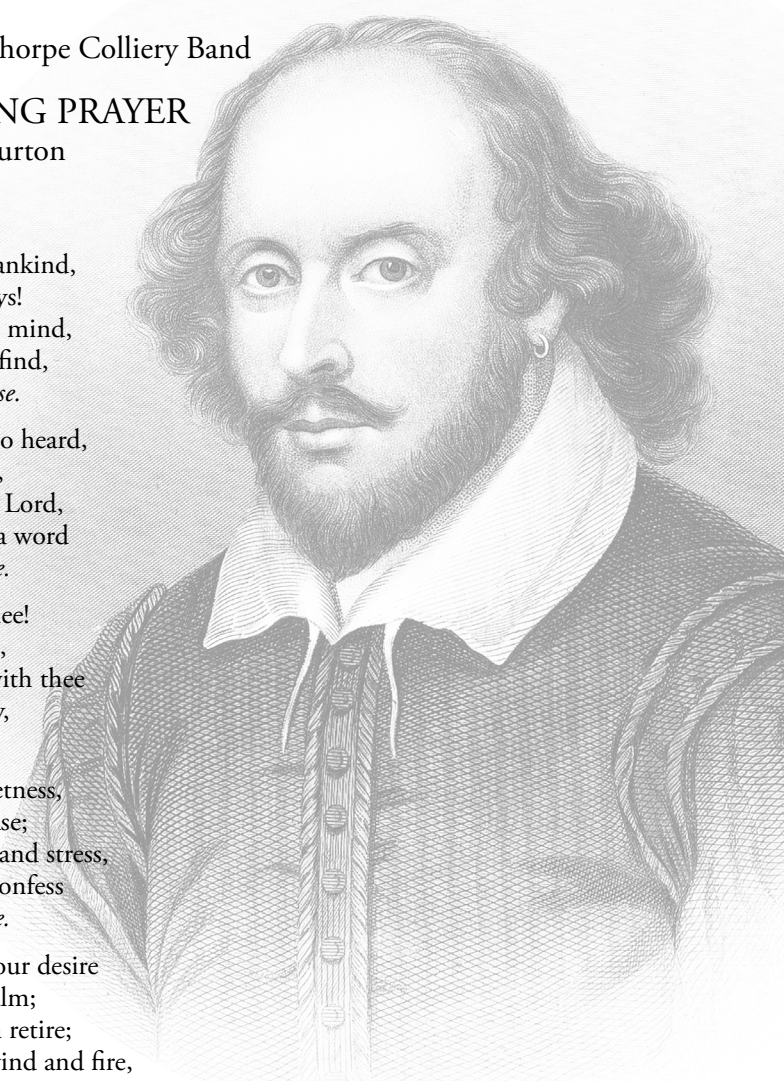
Dear Lord and Father of mankind,

Your peace in our hearts, Lord, at the end of the day.

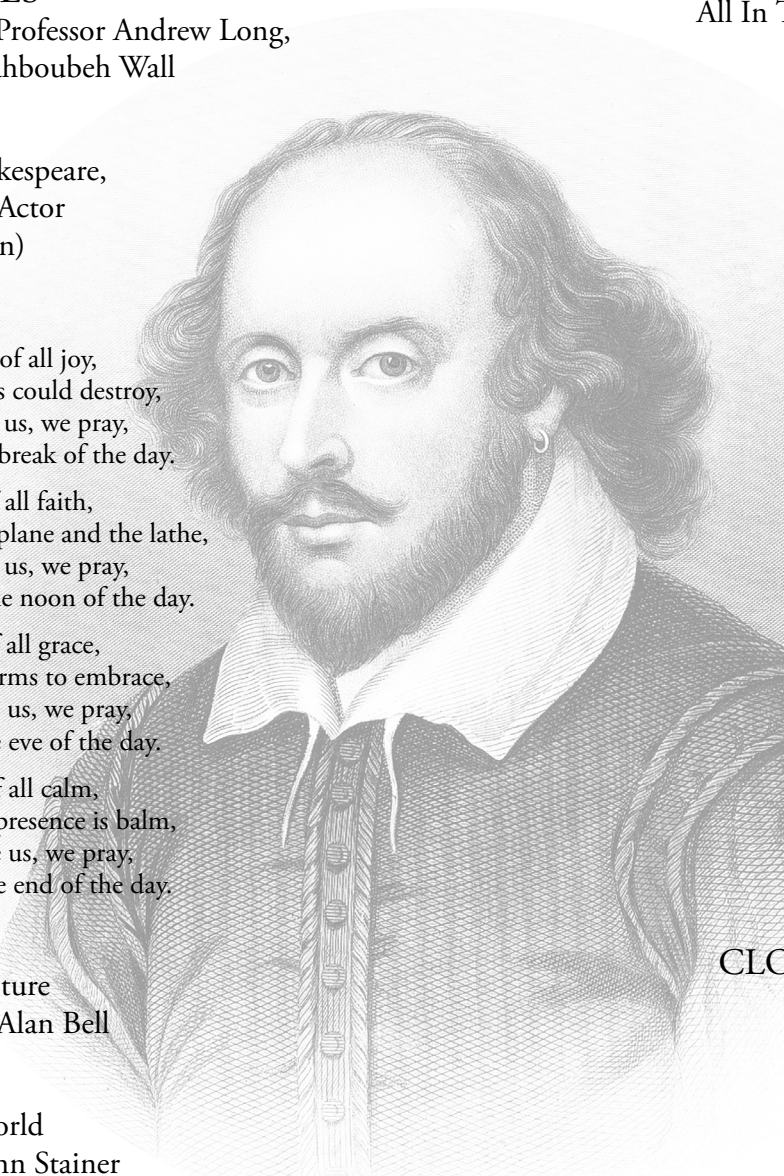
